of the past four years.

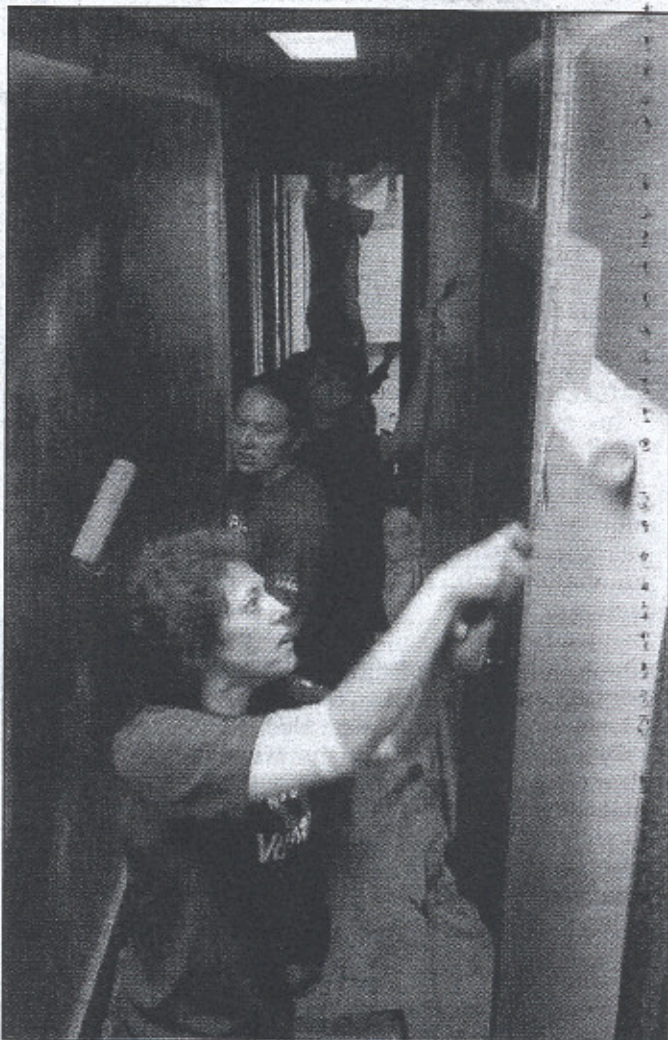
This year the team was out in three locations (Food Bank, Community Services offices and a safe house) for Abbotsford Community Services, completing jobs like painting, power washing and landscaping.

A room, a couple of hallways and a bathroom were painted by the KPMG crew, and helped get the space spruced up for the Feb. 1 dental service target date.

Murray added the KPMG squad also helped build hampers and stock shelves.
